## **Membership Program**

This proposal, which the board must approve is for the creation of a membership program for NCAWM.

Evidence shows that a membership program is one of the most effective ways nonprofit organizations can grow. Such programs take various forms and are among our most important income resources. Because fees are paid on a regular basis — monthly, or yearly — membership funds provide stability and long-term planning as it is easier to forecast the income stream.

History suggests that if NCAWM conceive a membership program in the first half of 2023 with the "Friends of Association" program, we propose it will conceive more than \$50,000 to launch a ministerial infrastructure plan. Models are members-as-donors and members-as-advocates.

A new membership plan will be underway by the end of 2022 and will be launched by January-March 2023.
